What's Happening @ Prince of Peace

Special Meeting of the Congregation Sunday, March 1, 2020 @ 12pm

The congregation is being asked to accept the recommendations of the Generosity Committee & Congregation Council to allocate portions of the gifts from the estate of Rose Diestler. This includes a tithe of \$76K to support both Lutheran Disaster Response and Keystone Community Services, plus \$200K dedicated in matching funds to support an appeal to raise an additional \$50K to make the Enduring Gifts Fund active. The congregation is currently being led in a discernment process to determine the use of the remaining funds (approx. \$485K).
