From Pastor Anita Beste

I celebrate my birthday this month. So does Prince of Peace. (Number 49 for the church; just a few years more than that for me.) October 6, 1957 marked the formal organization of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. Pastor Bragstad was installed, the constitution was adopted, officers were elected and the first group of charter members was received.

So a year from now – October 2007 – we will mark our 50th anniversary as a church. How shall we tell the story of who we have been and how God has worked in us and through us? And where does the story go from here?

I read the 40th anniversary booklet. **“There was a vision . . .”** it begins in letters a half inch tall. “... a vision of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of annually sponsoring 40 new congregations. Within this vision was a home mission church to serve the rapidly growing St. Paul, MN suburb of Roseville.”

We began our first 50 years because of a vision of the national church. With what vision shall we begin the next 50 years? And how shall we claim it as our own?

How shall we tell the story of who we have been? What personal and corporate stories can we tell about why it mattered that Prince of Peace was here these last 49 years?


How shall we shape the vision of who we can be in the future? What future does God have in mind for us – as that part of the body of Christ called Prince of

Peace in Roseville, Minnesota in the first half of the 21st century?

I’ve been thinking of different ways we tell our stories. For instance, I tell my story differently based on the question asked. Where are you from? – and you hear my story based on the 14 houses in 6 different states that I’ve lived. What do you do? - and you’ll hear my story about being a teacher, a mother, an arts administrator, and then, a pastor. Tell me about your family – and you’ll hear my story through relationships – how I met Steve 30 years ago and life as a mother of 3 daughters now in their 20’s.

We are poised at a significant point in our history together. Some of the conflict of the last year has made us ask good and hard questions of ourselves: Who are we? and Where are we going? and How does that all get decided? God’s spirit moves us and shapes us and shakes us up through these times. And our 50th Anniversary presents us with a similar task – celebrating our milestones also makes us ask good and hard questions: Who have we been? Where are we going? And how shall we discover together the vital and faithful future which God – even now – is birthing within us.

How shall we tell our ongoing story? At the 40th anniversary, the story began – “There was a vision...” For the 50th, won’t it be exciting to hear the story continue – **“There is a vision.....”**

A Reflection on the Prince of Peace trip to Tanzania by Steve Beste

Whenever people ask me about my Tanzanian experience, I'm always reluctant to describe the severity of the poverty that I saw. I usually want to focus on the food or the hospitality or the beauty of the land—and indeed, all of that truly was wonderful.

But if I am engaged in conversation with someone long enough, I wend my recollections around to describing the school kids I saw who danced with old high-top Converse sneakers held together by duct tape, or who danced with no shoes at all. Or I recall an elder of the church in Bomalong'ombe who sat in the front of the church wearing the same well-worn Philadelphia Flyers jersey that he wore the day before, and the day before that. Or I tell about the women of the village who rose well

before dawn to squat before a cooking fire in a smoky shack to prepare us breakfast.

And, if I'm honest, I say that the poverty I saw makes me want to cry. I'll tell that person that I feel ashamed for ever complaining that I don't have enough when I am completely besotted with material things. I say that out of wonder more than anything else.

But the amazing part about these encounters with poverty is that these Tanzanians, like the villagers we met in Bomalong'ombe, don't think of themselves as poor. Sure, they need running water and better sanitation and medical care, and they certainly need our help to improve their housing—both for their schools and their villages. Yet they have in abundance a genuine openness to strangers and a

generous spirit. They smiled constantly, laughed easily and waved at us whenever we passed by.

Maybe that's the part of the trip I like sharing the most about my Tanzanian experience: how someone who has so much can learn from those who have so little.

There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. The church is such an interesting place because of the diversity that exists. We have a variety of opportunities here at Prince of Peace such as music programs for different ages: children's choir & chancel choir; devotional groups: women's circles, men's Bible studies, yoga devotion; and fellowship opportunities for specific age groups: FEAST for the high school students and the OK's group for those age 55 and older. We are an intergenerational organization and just like it is written in Corinthians, there are diversities of activities but it is the same God who works all in all here at Prince of Peace.

All of these separate groups come together weekly for worship and education. We include ALL members in Christian education from the nursery for infants and more formal education beginning at age 3 going through adulthood. What a wonderful way to come together as believers to help us experience God's love, learn more about Jesus' life, get answers to questions and grow in our faith with one another. We also include ALL members, no matter what age, in our worship services by welcoming everyone and encouraging each member to participate in leadership roles. I am pleased each week to see a diversity of volunteers to greet, usher, collect offering, serve communion, lector, provide music, and even provide the sermon.

As the coordinator of Children and Family Ministry, it is apparent that my focus is primarily on the youngest members of our congregation. So, that is why I am also delighted that we are willing to have the young members of our congregation participating in the

worship services. In addition to coming to the front of the sanctuary for the children's sermon, I have seen children helping with greeting, handing out bulletins, collecting offering and sharing musical talents so that we are truly one body serving God. Thank you for being a congregation that invites children to worship and encourages them to participate in all areas of the service!

Thoughts from Audrey

The last couple of days the weather has assured me that fall is well on its way. School has started. Sunday Morning Breakfast Club (Sr. High) has started. FEAST (Friends Eating and Sharing Together for Sr. High) on Wednesday Nights has started. Confirmation has started. Sunday Education has started. My study leave is over.

I believe that Prince of Peace's young people had a great summer and are ready for a new program year. Our young people continue to express their concern for "the least among us". We have new youth volunteering for the Prince of Peace Responders. As we have begun planning our activities and events, the Sr. High diligently plan service opportunities for themselves to do.

In July 18 of them, attended the ELCA Gathering. Prince of Peace youth with assistance from our congregation, contributed more than \$2,000 for the offering of the Gathering. As of July \$530,000 had been raised for "Hamiltons for Hunger". \$580,000 had been raised if Sunday mornings offerings to benefit 25 domestic and international ministries that support children, youth and families. \$130,000 in gift cards were collected as an "in-kind" offering to benefit six San Antonio organizations. And \$38,000 hours were donated in service San Antonio Ministries. Our youth were a part of this.

We took twelve High School Youth to Bay Lake to build a handicapped ramp, giving wheelchair access to a cabin. During the summer they mowed some lawns, did some painting, helped to get groceries, and helped with some lawn clean-up. We are all ready to roll up our sleeves and welcome fall.

The Youth want to invite you to the Oktober Fest they are hosting on Sunday, October 8th. All proceeds are for ELCA World Hunger. With your assistance they believe that they can surpass last year's \$3,600. See details on front page.
