

HABITS FOR LIFE

Healthy life habits become routine when they are practiced with regularity. Until a dental hygienist scared me with dire warnings, for example, I infrequently flossed my teeth. Now it's a part of a daily routine, and I don't think about it – it happens daily and naturally. Our parents do their best to teach us all kinds of healthy patterns. Some we pick up and others we later figure out are ones we wish we had done all along. And there are some things that we learn that help us grow beyond the skills of our origins.

There are healthy habits for our emotional well-being, for interpersonal skills, for our places of work, and for our spiritual grounding as well. We aren't born with these. Some are taught and some are picked up by trial and error. When couples come to the church prior to marriage, for example, pastors meet with them and impart some of the basics – the importance of active listening, being able to express one's wishes in positive ways, healthy steps for conflict resolution, discovering areas of strength and areas for growth. They are important tools and they are in keeping with the foundation of our Christian faith.

Our habit of coming together as a Christian community is a vital life habit. In Christian community we are reminded again and again of the foundation of our life – the starting point. When we neglect or forget our starting point, we risk losing our way in the daily rush of life. Our starting point is found in God who supports us with grace and who has made us for love. The habit of prayer – daily routines and spontaneous one-liners – is a healthy spiritual habit that guides all the others.

Again this May we confirm a number of our youth in their Christian faith. We have given them instruction in our core beliefs. We have called upon them to exercise their faith through service projects and in their day-to-day interactions in home and in school. We have given them some tools and encouragement for healthy spiritual habits. Now they affirm their baptism and take responsibility for putting their faith into practice. As the body of Christ, we support them with prayer and we welcome them into equal partnership in God's realm. And we hold our breath a bit – because we know that life is filled with distractions and it is easy to lose our way. So we pray for them.

Our confirmation students and we are not alone in this endeavor, however. Our God is always with us. When we lose our bearings God calls us back. We remember the habits of our faith, and God renews us to be a blessing as God intends us to be.

Children and Family Ministry—Ginger Ryan

In preparing for summer programs, I have spent much time recently reflecting on the theme for many ELCA camps this summer: *Listen! God is Calling*. From the ELCA website, the following is the description about the theme:

When Christians talk about having a vocation from God, we are saying that God calls us. The word vocation comes from the Latin vocare, which corresponds to the English "to call." The first thing you say about vocation is, "Thank you, God." The fact that God talks to us - that God calls us - is a wonderful thing. We are not left alone to make sense of our lives. We are not left alone to make it through the day. The God of the universe wants to communicate with us. The Bible talks about God's "Word" because God is a communicating God.

I believe that we should all continually be in a process of discernment and listening to God's calling. I have listened intently to God's call for my life during the last 20 months here at Prince of Peace. This was especially important, as there have been several people who have expressed strong feelings about my a leadership role in the church. However, while I listened

and communicated with God, I grew stronger in knowing that God has sent me to Prince of Peace as a witness to others that being a Christian requires love for one another in word and action. I have been encouraged and supported by many members of the congregation including adults, children and youth alike. I deeply appreciate those of you who were willing to follow Jesus' example and reach out to me and share God's love with me with supportive notes, phone calls, and positive comments. These actions have reinforced my belief that God created me, loves me, and accepts me as I am. THANK YOU!

Although I do feel called to be at Prince of Peace, I also feel God has given me the gift to care for and connect with children in ways that I am not able to in my position at Prince of Peace. It has been a difficult process of listening, but I feel that God is calling me to follow a slightly different career path.

Therefore, I will be leaving my position as Children and Family Ministry Coordinator with Prince of Peace as of May 14th to work full-time with Hennepin County as a Child Services Worker in the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) unit. I will be supporting children who

have been removed from their parents and making sure that the children's needs are being met in their temporary home.

Even though I am leaving my position on staff, I am not leaving the church. I plan to remain a member at Prince of Peace as I have found friendships here, am able to feel God's presence, and I feel a part of the Prince of Peace family. I look forward to finding time to once again to volunteer with our children and youth programs and watching their faith develop! Additionally, summer programs will continue as scheduled. Along with the help of Pastor Rogness, I will make sure that the summer programs will be fully supported with an intern and volunteers so that they will still take place. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns that you might have about this transition.

Nursery-Birth to 3 years old

Beginning this summer we will be reducing the age for children to come to the nursery without a parent to birth through age 3. This is the standard in other churches due to the difference in ability, developmental level, interest, and need for supervision. Our current space is also too small to safely accommodate a larger span in ages.

Due to the low use of the nursery during the summer and to stay within our budget, the Children's Ministry

Committee has decided to reduce the nursery attendant to only the 10:00 am service for the summer. The nursery will still be open and available during both services for parent(s) to come with child(ren), but there will only be an attendant to care for your child in your absence during the 10 am service.

Hopefully these changes will allow us to see more kids in church during the service and help us remember that our family continues to grow!

Thoughts from Audrey

This morning conversation in Breakfast Club was interesting. After reading the texts for today, we talked about the coming together of Christians across the world all celebrating Easter last Sunday. But the celebration of the resurrection of Christ was not only confined to sanctuaries and meeting rooms. It was also done in cyberspace, via a program called Second Life. Second Life creates an entire virtual world where people all around the world can meet and interact, buy virtual land, run virtual businesses, even get virtually married; in short, anything you can do in real life, you can do virtually on Second Life.

We shared some of the pros and cons with “going to church” virtually. Why would folks “do virtual church?” Why not “do virtual church?” Why do we go to church? The discussion led to an agreement that a large part of why we “go to church” was for the fellowship, our friends, to be a part

of a community. The agreement was that “doing virtual church” would not be able to fill these desires to be a member of a community with our friends and folks who care for each other.

Fellowship and community building are important to our young people. As you know, each year our young people host a dinner and auction as a fund-raiser for their summer trips. After we had set the date for Sunday, April 1st a group of youth came into my office with a “special” request. They thought with it being April Fool’s day that it would be perfect to host a Mystery Dinner. They were certain that *everyone* would love it.

Thirty youth and many parents and adults assisted with the preparations, cooking, serving, and clean up. We served 160 for dinner. In the end I believe that everyone got their whole meal—just not in the order that they might have normally eaten it. And some

just didn’t get that fork—they didn’t manage to order it. It was great to hear the laughter and feel the appreciation that filled the gym that night. If you missed this one, we’ll be doing another dinner and auction next spring. (November 4th we will host a dinner to raise money for ELCA World Hunger.)

Between the dinner and auction we have cleared over \$5,000.00 for the youth trips. Thank you to all who donated auction items. Thank you to those who purchased an auction items. But even more than the money we raised, all the kids have expressed what a great time it was, “when can we do it again?”

This is the fellowship and community that our young people want to be a part of in real life, real church, not “virtual church”. They are proudly members of Prince of Peace. Thank you for caring for them and accepting their care for you.

Tanzania Update

Boma La Ng'ombe Secondary School

"Dear Babu, Bibi and friends at Prince of Peace Lutheran church.

Grace and peace to you all. It is Holy Week and our members and students prepare for wonders of God's love on Good Friday and God's power over death on Easter. We rejoice with our brothers and sisters at Prince of Peace as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. On Maundy Thursday we will gather for the Lord's supper. On Good Friday there will be an evening service with 7 to remember our Lord's last seven words on the cross. On Easter Sunday we have one worship service. In our prayers on Easter, we will be remembering our sister church and asking that God will bless our partnership. May the spirit be evident in your joy. Alleluia!!! Greetings from Pastor Jane Chusi and all the people of Bomalang'ombe and my students and staff in the name of the Prince of Peace, the resurrected one-Jesus the Christ.

Blessings to you from our house-as well as from the church and school.

The above words are from an email received from Pastor Michael Mkinywa, Headmaster at Boma La' Ngombe Secondary School. He also sends his thanks for the money that has been contributed to the building project at the school. With the proceeds from the

Tanzanian Dinner in November, Prince of Peace was able to send \$6,512.78 for the building project and is supporting 20 secondary school students from the Bomalang'ombe Parish in 2007.

They have started collecting building materials such as stones, rocks, and sand for the foundation. It is still the rainy season, so they hope to be able to start building in June. Lack of transportation is still a problem for them at the school when someone becomes sick and needs to go to the dispensary which is 5 miles away in the village. They recently had to carry two students to the dispensary using bed frames on their shoulders.

When we were there in August, we left two disposable cameras at the school. They used one of them to take pictures of the first graduation at Boma La Ng'ombe Secondary School. That camera was returned to us last fall. The second camera was used to take pictures of the progress with the buildings at the school. That camera was returned to us in April. The permanent girls' dormitory now has a roof and the laboratory classroom building has the walls and roof done. Since the results of the Form IV exams have been announced (all of their students passed!) parents from all over the country want to send their children there. This year, there are more than 100 students enrolled in Form I. They have stopped taking any more students because there are not enough class rooms and dormitories. **"The Impossible is now Possible!"**

...This summer, I have an unbelievable opportunity to take part in a summer missions project sponsored by Campus Crusade for Christ. I will be going with approximately 60 other students to North Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. A summer spent on a project like this can be invaluable. Few other environments can top this in developing spiritual leadership and ministry skills to equip me for campus outreach and a lifetime of ministry. I know that God's calling for my life is to be a missionary and so this experience will be the first step along that path. It will be an amazing learning opportunity and preparation for the challenges and experiences that lie ahead.

Although these were just the beginning steps of my faith, without this solid beginning I may have never found the path I now know God wants to lead me down in my life.

BREAD FOR THE WORLD is a 33 year old nationwide Christian movement that seeks justice for the world's hungry people by lobbying our nation's decision makers. Prince of Peace has supported Bread For The World with monetary donations and letters in past years. In May the social concerns committee will be providing information for you to write letters to decision makers.

This year's theme is Seeds of Change from Matthew 17:20, "If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to the mountain, 'Move from here to there' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." In 2007 people of faith have a historic opportunity to reduce hunger here and abroad. The US Congress is reauthorizing the farm bill, which happens every five years. This bill is one of the most far reaching sets of laws in our country. It affects everyone who eats, especially the poor, and has impact on soil conservation, surplus food, food stamps and school breakfasts and lunches. The farm bill needs improvements in these areas: 1. provide better and broader support for family farmers 2. strengthen communities in rural America 3. help hungry people in this country afford a sufficient and nutritious diet 4. support the efforts of small-scale farmers in developing countries to sell their crops.

Sundays May 13 and 20 the social concerns committee will provide specifics of the farm bill to include in letters to decision makers. We will also provide regular mail and e-mail addresses. Look for our table between/after services to take part in this important mission to bring BREAD TO THE WORLD.
