Meals on Wheels is a program that provides nutritious meals to people who cannot access or prepare food for themselves. The Roseville Area program serves over 100 people each weekday. Over 400 volunteers from fifteen area churches and corporations take turns to deliver the meals directly to the client's door. These volunteers also serve as a check-up system to make sure that those who are receiving meals are safe and well each day.

Prince of Peace Council Corner

My parents were born during the early 1920's during the Depression. My father left school in the eighth grade to support his mother and sisters and their family farm in rural Upper Michigan. He worked for the Civilian Conservation Corps, helping build Isle Royale National Park on Lake Superior. During World War II, he fought in the Battle of the Bulge in Luxembourg. As a young girl, my mother did not speak English and the school nuns translated her lesson to French. She graduated high school in 1946 and moved to Detroit to find work to support her family back home. My parents met by chance in Detroit, married and started a family in 1951.

Growing up I was well aware of the multi-generational quality of our family. My father was thirty years old when my oldest brother was born and forty seven years old when my youngest sister was born. This seventeen year span created a generation gap between my older brothers and sisters and me and my younger siblings in addition to the gap between me and my Depression era parents. This dynamic presented a unique set of challenges and successes for our entire family.

Having started my own family later in life puts me in a family dynamic similar to my parents. When my son Charlie graduates from high school I will be fifty-seven years old. Our success depends on this rapidly changing world's willingness to understand and appreciate the life experiences that have shaped all of us.

My parents would accept nothing less.

I am the vine, you are the branches. John 15:5

This Bible verse gives us the image for the title of this newsletter. In this April and Easter season it also gives us a fertile image of our life and growth in God. It is a gray March day in Lent as I write this, but I know and trust in the warm brilliance of Easter days right around the corner. In the northern hemisphere our liturgical cycle of death and new life in Jesus is mirrored in the death and new life evident in the landscape.

At the noon Good Friday service each child received a budding daffodil – tightly closed, but ready to burst forth in new life – and this litany to pray .

A Litany for Spring

Green us, great God, for a spiritual springtime.

Give us courage of daffodils

Greetings from the Music Ministry Coordinator—Milt Warkentien

We've just finished the Lenten Season and for me it's been quite an emotional ride. We've gone from the solemnity of Ash Wednesday to the jubilation of Easter. I hope the music has helped enhance the incredible journey we've just experienced. From the comments I've heard it seems that the Holden Village Service is very well liked and should be used again next year. I want to thank all the worship leaders that made those Wednesday evening services possible.

Good Friday is probably the most emotional service for me. It's overwhelming for me that Jesus came to earth as a baby, only to suffer and die so we could be free. Even knowing that Jesus rose on the 3rd day doesn't diminish the power of the Good Friday Service. Hearing the tomb slam shut makes me realize how lucky I am. All the "troubles" of everyday life seem very trifling. How can I let my "troubles" eat at me, so when Jesus went through what he did for me?? How can I let my "troubles" eat at me so, when there are so many in this world that can only dream of the blessings I have?? My emotions really take a beating when the tomb is shut at the end of the Good Friday Service. What part of the Lenten Journey really brings out the emotions in you?? For me there's only one phrase that can possibly summarize what we've been blessed with and that's "Amazing Grace." This phrase is probably enhanced by the fact that I find the hymn so powerful. I urge you to take the time to read the words to "Amazing Grace" and reflect on the blessings that you have in your life.

As a song writer, "Amazing Grace" is one of those songs that I wish I'd have written. It has such a simple, flowing melody and such powerful words. Chris Tomlin and Louie Giglio have added a chorus to the hymn and use it after the 2nd and 3rd verses. Try reading this chorus where they use it, and I think

you'll find that it makes the hymn even more powerful. The chorus is, "My chains are gone. I've been set free, my God, my Savior has ransomed me. And like a flood His mercy reigns, unending love, amazing grace."

Our chains are gone because we've been set free by Christ's flood of unending love. What a gift we've been given. We live in a complex world where darkness seems to be getting darker all the time, but if we try to avoid all the negativity the media portrays to us and TAKE THE TIME to bring Christ's Love into our world, I think we'd see a lot more Light than darkness. This is not to say that I think we can be blind to the darkness that abounds, but that we CAN make this a Light filled world. When we ALL DO a little, it CAN add up to a lot. Remember the "Splash Campaign" many years ago? That's what it was all about. One drop of water makes waves for along time. Have you seen the movie "Pay it Forward?" The same theory applies in that movie. The movie tells the story of a young boy that tries doing something good to someone and only asks that they "Pay it Forward." I truly believe that one little ray of Light can impact so much more than we can ever imagine. TAKE THE TIME TO SHARE CHRIST'S LIGHT !

Thoughts from Audrey

Eight years ago, two youth ministers and I, began VIBE Urban Youth Ministries with 13 ELCA congregations in the heart of St. Paul. As a collaborative youth ministry model we served these congregations with one ministry. As we began to develop relationships between these congregations and our youth, we held a potluck as our kickoff event. This was well attended and families very proudly brought their favorite dishes. One family brought a taco dish, a curry chicken, and egg rolls.

One of our elderly church ladies was very excited to see so many folks at this event. As it came time to load up the food table, everyone put their dishes on the table. Without thinking our devoted 'church lady' said that (meaning taco dish, curry chicken, and egg rolls) didn't belong on the table. This was a very faithful member of one of our congregations. She was a gentle and loving person and would never have said anything to hurt another's feelings. She was caught off guard, because she had never experienced a potluck table at her church with the diversity this table had.

I have been reminded of this experience often when the youth and I are putting together the dinners at Prince of Peace. I often hear what is....? We all grew up with families favorite foods which gives us a look into our heritage. I have enjoyed listening to our young people share their favorite foods, their heritage, and giving us a window into who they are.

This year we have taken on a dinner focusing on Scandinavian Fair. Some of our youth grew up with many of these foods. For others these foods have not been a part of their heritage. We have had many opportunities to share the favorites that we grew up with. Some of these favorites will be part of our lives for a long time. We learn much about each other as we share our heritage and favorites. I am proud of our young people and their appreciation of the diverse places we all came from.
