Jesus says “I am the bread of life”

Read

The Bible talks a lot about bread. In our lesson this week, Jesus says, “our ancestors ate manna in the wilderness.” This refers to Moses and the people who wander in the wilderness for 40 years. Read the story Manna, Quail, and Water, Spark Story Bible pages 90-93

Later Jesus feeds 5,000 people with 5 loaves and two fish. Read the story Jesus Feeds 5,000, Spark Story Bible pages 426-31

Watch worship Sunday online. How does Pastor Peter tell the story of Jesus being the bread of life?

Discuss

- Why is bread so important?
- How do the stories of manna and feeding the 5000 similar? How are they different?
- Do the people ask for food? Or is it just provided?
- Do the people do anything to deserve the food?
- How does this bread show God’s love?
- Jesus says, “I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.” John 6:35. What do you think Jesus means by this?
- Every week in worship we hear these words: “Jesus says this is my body given for you” and the pastor says “the body of Christ given for you.” This is part of communion and what Jesus first said to the disciples at the Last Supper. Read The Last Supper in the Spark Story Bible, pages 462-7.

Activity Ideas

- Having enough food is one of our basic needs of life. What can you do to make sure that others have enough to eat? Do something like going to the grocery store and buying food to donate to the food shelf. Or go and volunteer someplace that helps feed people.

- In the Lord’s Prayer we pray “give us this day our daily bread.” Pray the Lord’s Prayer together: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.
